

Dance along to the Heartbeat of the Garifuna

Among Belize's many vibrant cultures, the Garifuna people stand out for their celebration of life through rhythm and dance. From the first beat of the drum, their music pulls you in. The melodies tell stories of ancestry, resilience, and community, blending African and Indigenous roots into something timeless and uniquely Belizean. It's hard not to smile or sway when you hear the steady drums, the laughter, and the call-and-response songs that seem to lift the whole room. The Garifuna people don't just perform; they invite you to share in their joy, to dance, to taste, and to feel their culture in motion.

Every November, that joy comes to life during Garifuna Settlement Day, a national celebration held on November 19th. The day honors the arrival of the Garifuna people to Belize in 1802 and is one of the most colorful and spirited celebrations in the country.

of the Garifuna people's arrival by sea. Boats glide toward shore as dancers sing traditional songs, recreating the moment their ancestors first landed on Belizean soil.

As the sun rises, the celebration continues with lively parades, drumming, and traditional dances that keep the energy high well into the night. The smell of coconut milk, cassava, and fresh seafood fills the air as families and visitors gather to enjoy classic Garifuna dishes such as hudut (fish cooked in coconut broth, served with mashed plantain) and sere (a savory seafood soup). The music, food, and friendly faces make it impossible not to feel welcome.

Visitors staying on Ambergris Caye don't have to travel far to experience this culture firsthand. The Black and White Garifuna Restaurant

Cooking the Maya Way at Upe Nai



Nestled within the rolling green hills of San Antonio Village in the Cayo District, Upe Nai Cultural Center, meaning "One Dream" in Yucatec Maya, is a family-run gem that grew from humble Sunday dinners into a full-fledged culinary and cultural experience. Founded by Leonila "Mama Nila" Mai and her daughter, Stephanie Martinez, Upe Nai invites guests to savor authentic Maya and Mestizo dishes cooked over open-fire hearths, from bubbling pots of Caldo de Gallina to citrus-marinated Poc Chuc.




Last year, we had the pleasure of experiencing the fabulous food and warmth of this remarkable family firsthand, and the memory of those smoky, love-filled meals still lingers. What could be better than returning to learn how to cook some of their signature dishes over a fire hearth, just as their ancestors did?

Our morning begins with a warm welcome from Stephanie, under the shade of a covered open-air kitchen surrounded by jungle, where busy chickens forage for food. Before long, you're learning to prepare



traditional Maya dishes much as they have been for centuries, using timeless techniques, tools, and fresh local ingredients. First, we fashion a hand broom from the dried leaves of a corn cob, because you "Always have to keep your tabletop clean." Next, we shell the hard kernels from the cob, winnow the chaff, (gently tossing the corn kernels in a basket to remove the outer seed coverings) and then grinding the corn (after it's been boiled in food-grade lye) by hand with a stone "mano y metate" (mano is the handheld stone used for grinding,











while the metate is the larger, stationary stone with a concave surface against which the mano is worked) until a soft "masa" dough forms. As we go about our prepping, Steph shares stories about Maya traditions and how food plays a central role in community life, ceremonies, and family gatherings. We even learn the lively Corn Dance, as Steph engages us in the moves while multitasking and tending to the open-hearth fire. The air fills with the scent of roasting corn and wood smoke, the hallmark fragrance of a Maya kitchen.

Corn masa is the soul of Maya cuisine, and from it, many dishes are made. After taking some additional steps for each dish, we form small balls



from the dough, which we later press flat to form salbutes. Some of the masa is diluted with broth and cooked to the consistency of mashed potatoes, which, once cooled, is used in the tamales. Meanwhile, some masa is added to thicken the broth of the delicious chicken stew we prepare, creating the creamy "k'óol" that's part of the tamale filling.














Beyond the laughter and storytelling that fill the open-air kitchen, there's a deeper purpose. Stephanie's classes preserve ancient knowledge that was once passed only from mother to daughter, ensuring it continues to nourish both Maya families and curious travelers. After a few hours of shelling, grinding, kneading, chopping, pressing, wrapping, seasoning, and a little dancing, we are the proud chefs of tamales wrapped in banana leaves, filled with stewed chicken in a creamy k'óol, and puffy, crisp salbutes toasted on a hot comal over the open fire (a flat, round griddle made of cast-iron or pottery), mounded with shredded stew chicken and a variety of toppings and spicy, fire-roasted habanero salsa we've prepared.

We sit together as new friends, enjoying our well-earned meal. There's laughter, conversation, and a quiet sense of gratitude that settles over the table. It's a meal shared not in a restaurant, but in a home, and it feels profoundly special.

This hands-on cooking class includes lunch and beverages. It usually begins at 9AM and lasts three to four hours. They are happy to accommodate food allergies, dietary restrictions, and vegetarian preferences. Children and families are welcome, too, making it an ideal hands-on experience for curious young travelers.





Nearby, the Blue Morpho Butterfly Exhibit enchants visitors with hundreds of brilliant blue butterflies fluttering through a lush enclosure. Guests can observe every stage of their life cycle, from tiny eggs to shimmering adults, and even witness new butterflies emerging.

For something more active, glide down the Macal River by canoe. This calm, scenic paddle offers a tranquil way to see wildlife and rainforest from a new perspective. Iguanas bask on low branches, kingfishers dart across the water, and the dense canopy hums with life. If you're lucky, the distant call of howler monkeys echoing through the treetops adds a touch of wild jungle magic to the experience.







Situated within the tropical grounds of the San Ignacio Resort Hotel in Belize's western Cayo District, the Green Iguana Conservation Project demonstrates that conservation can be both exciting and enjoyable. Since 1996, this award-winning program has been working to protect and restore the green iguana (Iguana iguana), which was once threatened in the country, while also providing visitors with the opportunity to interact with one of Belize's most charismatic reptiles.

On a guided tour, guests step inside a shaded habitat filled with bright-green iguanas of all ages, from tiny hatchlings to impressive adults lounging on branches. Knowledgeable guides share insights into the species' life cycle, its importance to Belize's ecosystems, and the threats it faces in the wild. You can even feed or gently hold

an iguana for a one-of-a-kind photo opportunity.



But what really sets this project apart is its innovative temperature-controlled incubation program. The team doesn't just raise iguanas; they use science to influence the sex of the hatchlings. In green iguanas, cooler incubation temperatures (around 28–30°C/82-86°F) produce females, while warmer ones (above 31°C/87+F) produce males. By maintaining conditions in the cooler range, the project intentionally hatches more females, a crucial strategy for rebuilding wild populations.

Why females? Because they're the future. Each female can lay up to 40 eggs per season, dramatically increasing the number of hatchlings that can later be released into Belize's forests and riverbanks. Focusing on females not only accelerates population recovery but also restores balance to ecosystems where iguanas were once heavily hunted for meat and eggs.

It's a perfect example of conservation powered by curiosity and proof that sometimes, saving a species comes down to just a few degrees of difference.
